I work in the only state-owned tertiary hospital which caters to patients from llorin city and its environs. The gains from this fellowship will transform the outcome of care these patients receive. Details of this experience will be shared at the regular surgery meetings of my institution and the hospital grand round. I intend to generate implementable protocols that can be translated nationally following collaborations with my ever-eager colleagues on the national plastic surgery forum.

Coincidentally, I am currently working on advocacy to increase public awareness of plastic surgical services in Ilorin. The best advert is a satisfied customer, evidenced by the renewed hope ignited in an 18-year-old who had a successful immediate breast reconstruction and free nipple graft, and the hospital community who are the chief emissaries.

Furthermore, we recently observed fewer residents choosing to specialize in plastic surgery due to the apparent lackluster in outcomes. I was able to recruit some by executing fantastic procedures for cases that otherwise may have been managed conservatively with sub—optimal outcomes. This fellowship will augment this.
